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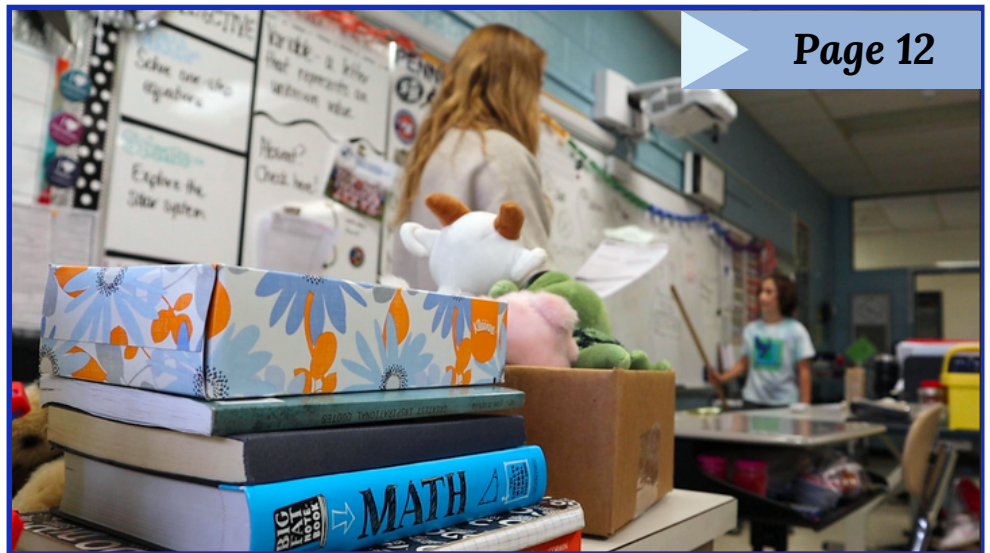
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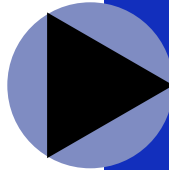

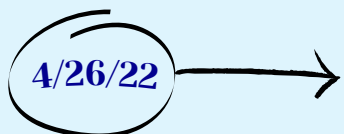

TUESDAY, April 26th at 7PM

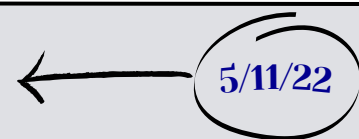
According to studies by the Centers for Disease Control, one in six students ages two to eighteen experience a mental, behavioral, or developmental disorder. Supporting anxious children at home, in school and in the community is pivotal to their social and emotional well-being. To help parents get an understanding of the types of anxiety and how anxiety presents in children and adolescents, Dr. Suzi Millar of Rutgers University Behavioral Health Care's School-Based Training program will speak about how to recognize behavioral, social and emotional responses to anxiety, as well as how parents can support or respond to their children.

The South Hunterdon FFA Chapter had a successful day at the New Jersey FFA Spring Career Development Event held at Rutgers University on April 7th, 2022. Career Development Events are part of the Agricultural Education Experience that allow for students to demonstrate what they learn in the classroom and apply it to everyday job opportunities. The National FFA, which is a student run organization for students who are interested in agriculture and agricultural science, “offers twenty-four different CDEs that cover job skills in everything from communications to mechanics.”

This year four high school and two middle school students competed in the Agricultural Technology and Mechanical Systems CDE. In this event members were tested on their knowledge and problem solving skills in five different agricultural technology and mechanical areas including compact equipment, electricity, environment and natural resources, machinery and equipment and structures. The high school team represented our chapter well as they placed 3rd in the State closely followed by the middle school team who placed 4th. In addition to these team placings all South students ranked in the top 10 individually as well!

It's springtime, and that means testing season is underway! All of the juniors did a great job in taking the new NJGPA, or NJ Graduation Proficiency Assessment that is now a state graduation requirement. Our juniors were on time and prepared with their Chromebooks each morning of testing and really took both the English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics sections of the test seriously. Great job, juniors! We expect scores to be released to us this summer.

Immediately after spring break, many of our students will sit for the NJSLA, or NJ Student Learning Assessment. Students should come to school on time, prepared with their fully charged Chromebooks each day, and calculator on Mathematics testing days.

2nd Grade ▶ STUDYING HABITATS

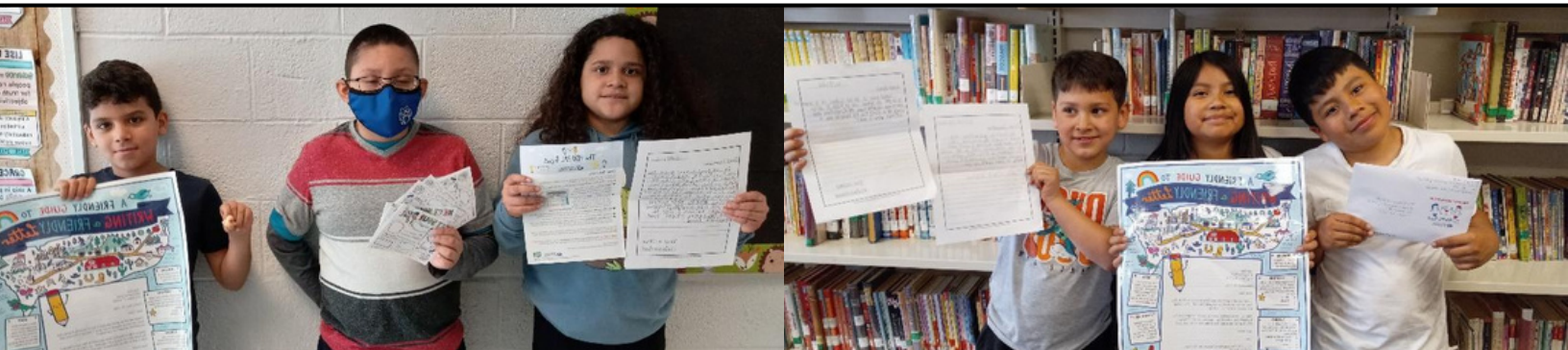

PEN PAL PROJECT

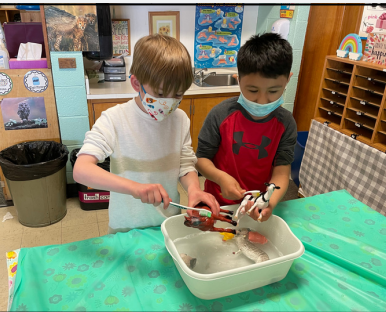

Force & Motion Unit

During our force and motion unit the LPS third graders had a fun, interactive experience as they were challenged with the job of working as teams of four to build a sled for children to ride on.

The third graders needed to consider what materials they should use in order to ensure that the sled would slide down the "hill" without a push or a pull. Also, they had to ensure that all children would fit on the sled without falling off. In addition, the children needed to utilize their math skills, and work together to follow a budget as they "shopped" for the most useful supplies for the task.

The students worked to complete their sleds after working as a class to create a rubric. This rubric helped guide them to a successful outcome.
