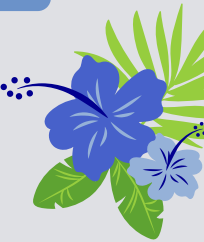

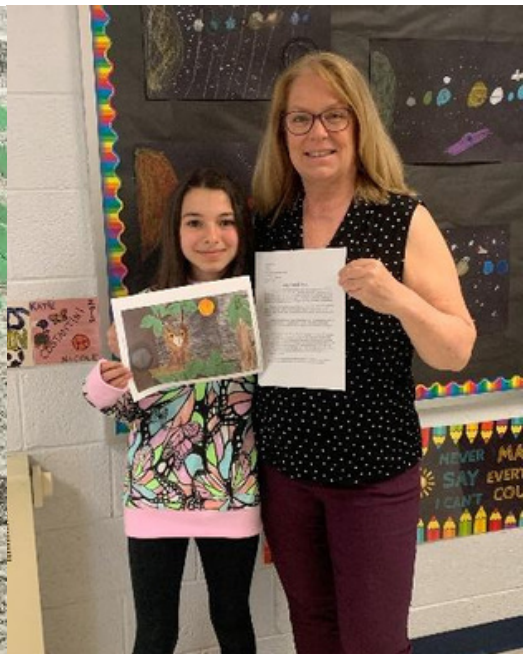


Hunterdon County First Place

BETTER HEARING & SPEECH MONTH

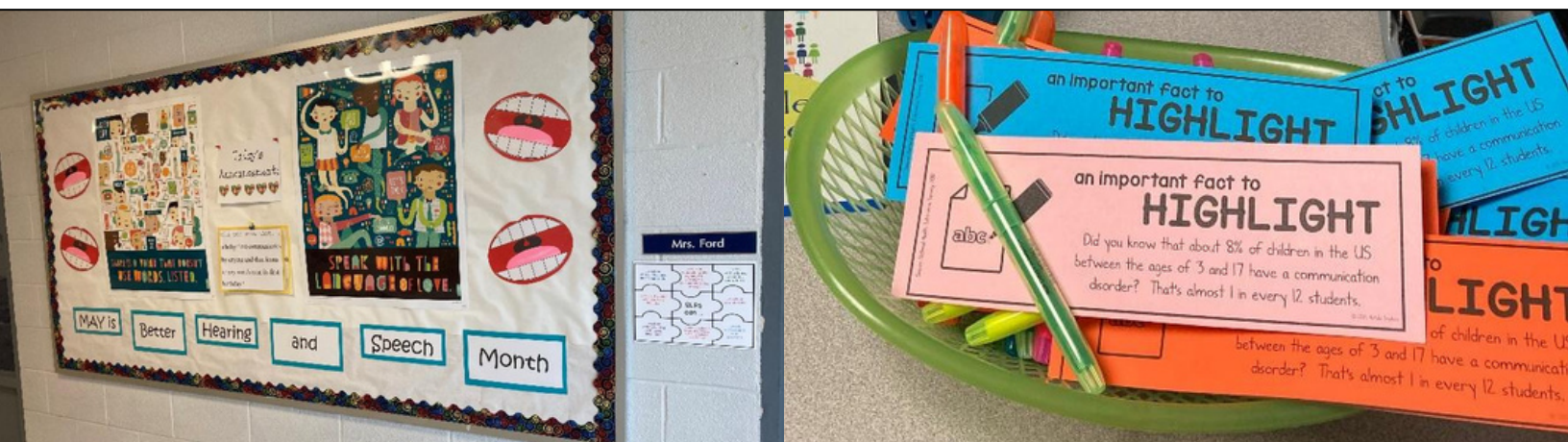

Special lessons during therapy sessions with Mrs. Ford highlighted the importance of achieving speech and language goals and objectives.

Fun giveaways were combined with handouts which outlined the important ways that speech-language specialists can support students and colleagues in the classroom setting. Teachers were reminded to take care of their voices by staying hydrated, since being part of a profession which requires them to speak more than the average person on a daily basis, puts them at risk for voice disorders.

A person's communication skills are critical at each stage of life—for young children, as a strong foundation for language and literacy; for school-aged children, as a requirement for academic and social success; and for adults, as a key part of their career and personal relationships. 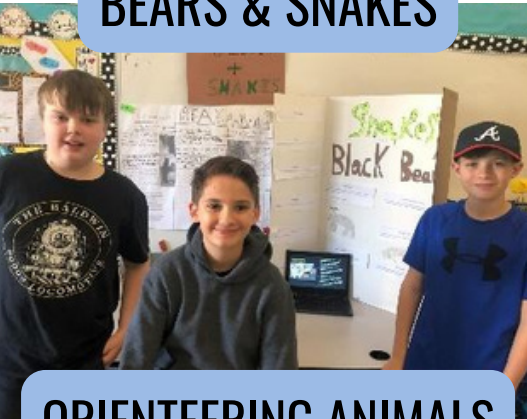

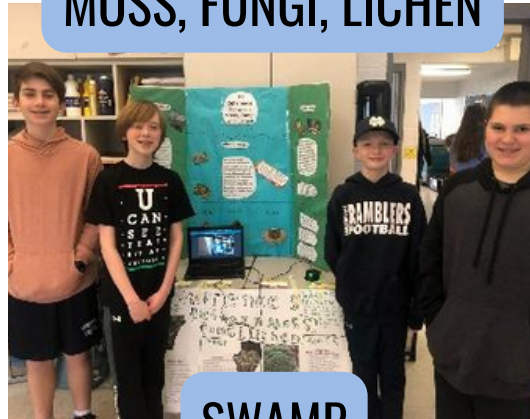
CAMP FAIRVIEW

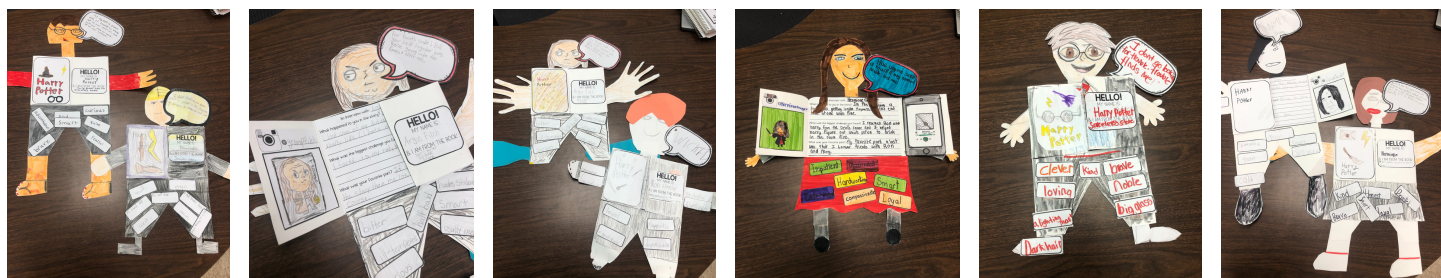
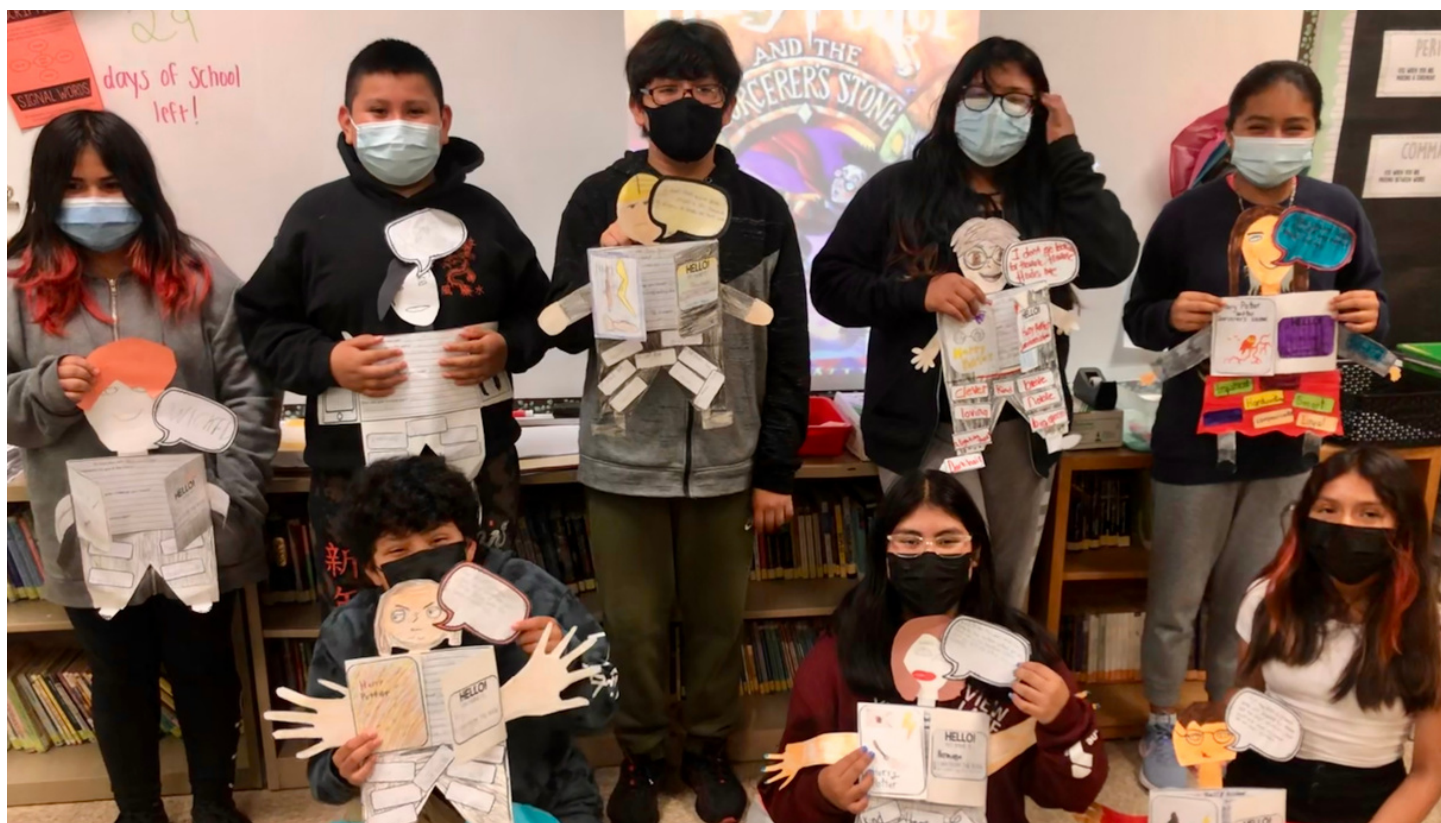
Camp will be 8:30 to 12:30 from June 20th to July 29th.

SOUTH HUNTERDON GRAD NAMED EAGLE SCOUT

Boy Scouts of America Troop 65, Ringoes, NJ has named Daniel Ingersoll their 2021 Eagle Scout. Daniel graduated from South Hunterdon Regional High School in 2021 and just finished up his first year at Moravian University in Bethlehem, PA.

Daniel's notable community project involved improving White Oak Trail in Delaware Township. His efforts included the installation of a boardwalk, bench, nature trail post identifiers, trail markers, and signs, as well as trail maintenance.

His overall goal was to make the trail more enjoyable and easy to navigate while highlighting the components that make the trail interesting to community members, hikers and outdoor enthusiasts.

"I definitely think the tight-knit community at South Hunterdon left a big impact as I had tons of support from the community in terms of fundraising and just help on the project," Daniel explained.

Daniel first walked the trail back in May of 2020 during a time of uncertainty and quarantine. He completed his work a year later in the spring of 2021 just before finishing his studies at South.

"It was really nice and really amazing to see all the work that I did and all of the help I had to make the trail more enjoyable," Daniel said.

The White Oak Trail project alone is just part of Daniel's path to becoming an Eagle Scout. Daniel held several positions of leadership within the Troop throughout his scout career. He participated in a variety of service projects, earned a minimum 21 Merit Badges, and attended camping trips, most notably a high-adventure backpacking trip to Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico. Daniel continues to stay involved and support the troop and community when he is able by attending meetings and participating in service projects when he is home for a visit. Although he has limited time due to his busy schedule as a college soccer player, he hopes to give back to the troop that has given so much to him.

Daniel credited making connections within the South Hunterdon community as a great starting point to building a positive future. Being able to take advantage of the various opportunities provided within a tight-knit community can be a springboard for future success.
