- Classes begin Monday, February 5th, 2024. The spring semester runs until Friday, May 31, 2024.
- You must complete and sign the registration form for your child to attend the Enrichment Club. Please submit forms at www.lpsenrichment.com and checks to your classroom teacher or the main office.
- There is a fee of \$300.00 a class. There are 14-17 sessions a semester, depending on the day. As a non-profit, our goal is to offer a sustainable high quality service to our students. Fees are used to pay educators and cover overhead costs.
